The Twin Tunnels.



The new boring contractor, the Seymour-Cap Partnership, which is made up of the companies Frontier-Kemper, J.F. Shea and Aecon, started work last July after the previous contractor Bilfinger-Berger Canada (BBC) withdrew/were fired, citing safety concerns.

The new partnership bid \$181 million to complete the job. It will proceed using the original engineering design and the two tunnel boring machines currently in place. These machines belong to BBC at \$8 million each, part of \$38 million worth of equipment confiscated by Metro Vancouver and the subject of a major law suit.

However both tunnels are currently about 180m below Mount Fromme and should be complete by early 2011. According to your LVCA rep the partnership is working extremely well with Metro Vancouver.

The legal wrangling will take longer to resolve and at what cost? BBC is suing Metro Vancouver, the project engineer Hatch Mott MacDonald and the landowner, the DNV, alleging “unlawful and wrongful” dismissal. BBC is being counter sued for any extra costs incurred as a result of their failing to complete the contract.

The original cost of the project was to be around \$200 million. The current projection is double that at \$400 million.

President’s message-LVCA as a Conduit for Ideas

3. A revised traffic plan around the planned Seylynn project on Fern Street
4. A smart solution to replacing the bridge on Keith Rd.
5. New banners along Lynn Valley Road, to go up after the Olympic banners come down.
6. Gateway signs on Lynn Valley Road and Mountain Highway to let people know they are entering Lynn Valley.
7. More waste and recycling facilities in the Town Centre.

Council Corner by Robin Hicks Oct 2009

A comprehensive police review has been completed for the three North Shore municipalities and is now available on the District website or a hard copy can be provided through me. It contains detailed analyses and a series of potential outcomes.

1. Consolidation
2. RCMP
3. A municipal force.

The District has been awarded infrastructure stimulus grants totalling \$1,587,000 for Keith Road and Marine Drive and another \$1,072,000 from the Building Canada Fund for priority sidewalks and Lynnmour dyke protection. A further \$1,600,000 has also been gained for the Windsor artificial field upgrade. A grand total of \$4.25 million!

On a wider Metro Vancouver basis, a solution to waste disposal is a high priority. After recycling there still remains in excess of one million tonnes per year for disposal. As a region we are running out of landfill space and so alternative technologies, including waste to energy (incineration) which has successfully been implemented in many European countries, are under consideration. An updated Solid Waste management plan is scheduled for completion later this year.

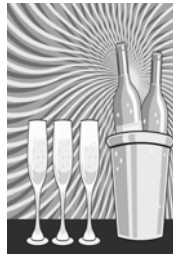
